#### **Lizard Habitat - Prep to Grade 2**

Session to be held outdoors, weather permitting.

#### Activities 🔗



Start by introducing blue-tongue lizards:

· students think about what their home is like, what they need to be healthy and safe

Introduce elements that make up a lizard habitat:

· water, rock, shelter, food Collect sticks, leaves, small logs

Students place rock, water, dig in plant at selected site.

Discuss how to care for the habitat and make it a welcoming place for a lizard.

Follow up - present at school assembly so all students know how to care for the habitat site.
