

## LESSON PLAN

### Lizard Habitat - Prep to Grade 2

*Session to be held outdoors,  
weather permitting.*

#### Activities

Start by introducing blue-tongue lizards:

- students think about what their home is like, what they need to be healthy and safe

Introduce elements that make up a lizard habitat:

- water, rock, shelter, food

Collect sticks, leaves, small logs

Students place rock, water, dig in plant at selected site.

Discuss how to care for the habitat and make it a welcoming place for a lizard.

#### Objective

The aim of this session is to introduce students to understanding habitat and the elements needed to support biodiversity

#### Learning Intentions

At the end of this session students will be able to:

- identify what makes a healthy and safe lizard home
- observe for signs of lizard habitation
- tell other students how to care for the site

#### Reflection

Draw a lizard habitat - think about what a lizard needs in its home

Follow up - present at school assembly so all students know how to care for the habitat site.
